Ending the forum with a reflective question can not only bring a sense of *closure* to the discussion but also move the group to *common ground* and/or *next steps*. Questions to end the forum also depend upon the purpose and goal of the forum.

Purpose	Sample Ending Questions
Individual Reflection	How has your thinking about the issue changed?
	How has your thinking about other people's views changed?
	How has your perspective changed as a result of what you heard in the forum?
	What didn't we work through?
Group Reflection	Can we identify any shared sense of purpose/direction?
	What trade-offs are we, or are we not, willing to make to move in a common direction?
	What do we still need to discuss/resolve?
Next-Step Reflections	How can we use what we learned about ourselves in this forum?
	Do we want to meet again?
Feedback	What value is most important to you in regards to this issue?
